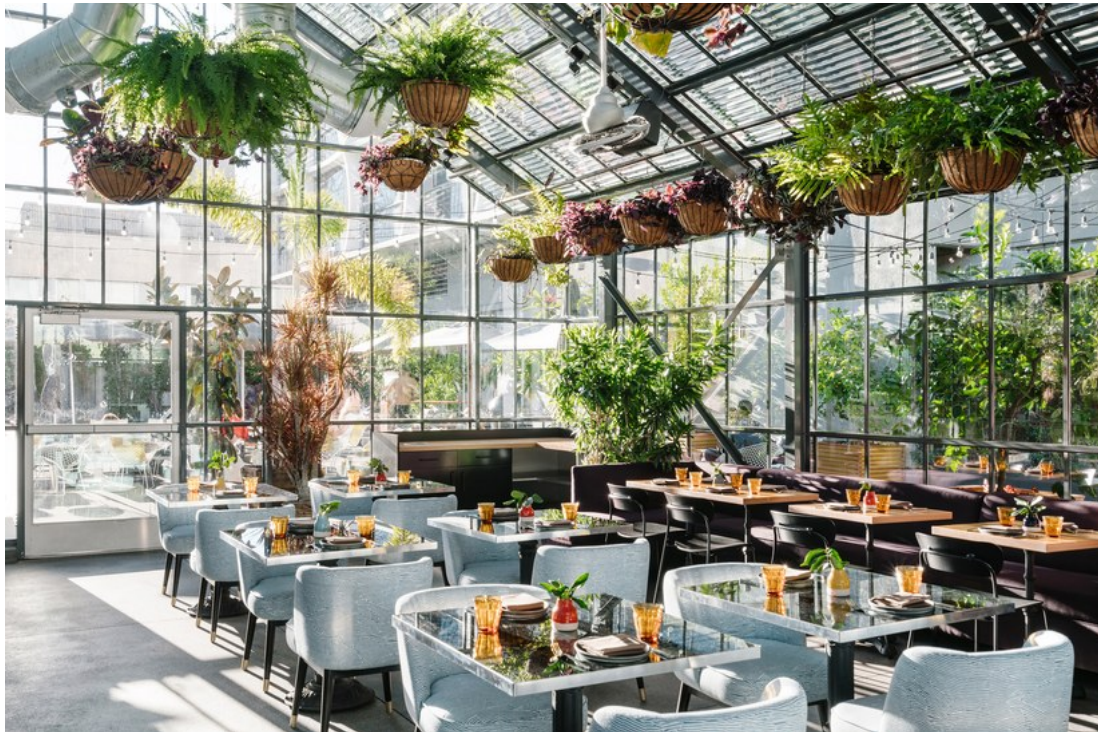


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11 Things to Do in Koreatown, Los Angeles: The Neighborhood Guide

The LINE L.A.

Located in the heart of K-Town, this Sydell Group property is a playground for adults. There's Break Room 86, an '80s-themed, cocktail-fueled karaoke bar, where every so often a Michael Jackson impersonator dances on a makeshift stage. During the daytime, brunchgoers flock to Openaire, the restaurant located in an oversize greenhouse beside the pool. Downstairs in the lobby, weekends turn into a bit of a live dance party, complete with DJs, and there's even a design shop from the folks at Poketo. While the hotel is right in the thick of the Koreatown action, sometime it feels like there's no reason to ever leave the grounds.
